Why Join The SPE?

The Society of Professional Economists is Europe's largest network of economists, with over 1200 members.

Membership includes regular monthly seminars, masterclasses from leading researchers to ensure members are at the forefront of knowledge, professional development opportunities, job postings for economists, and free access to our annual conference.

Members are drawn from all areas of the profession including finance and commerce, industry, government departments, private sector consultants, business schools and universities. The Society welcomes both established economists and younger members, including recent graduates and students intending to follow a career in economics.

Learn more and meet fellow practitioners:

The Society offers a wide range of benefits to its members. But there are six core services that the Society provides to its members and which lie at the heart of what it does:

- A world-class speaker event series, in which leading economists and policymakers discuss and debate current economic issues. The in-person meetings typically involve presentations by our guest speakers for 45-60 minutes, followed by questions and then networking drinks. Where possible the meetings are filmed, allowing members who are unable to attend to view a recording of proceedings on our website.
- High-profile annual events: Our annual conference – which is typically held in the autumn – attracts world-class speakers every year. In recent years it has featured Philip Lane, Sir Ivan Rogers, Ben Broadbent, Sir Charles Bean, Robert Chote, Dame DeAnne Julius and has been chaired by Stephanie Flanders. This event is FREE for members. Another highlight of the year is our Annual Dinner in recent years, this has featured Mark Carney, George Osborne, Mario Draghi, Loretta Mester, Andrew Bailey and Philip Lane.
- A series of recorded interviews with prominent economists and policymakers including Lord Mervyn King, Lord Gus O'Donnell, Martin Wolf CBE, Dambisa Moyo and Ed Balls.
- Opportunities for professional development: the SPE runs a Continuous Professional Development Programme and a series of masterclasses presented by leading lights in their field.
- Recruitment: a large number of employers and recruiters advertise job opportunities for economists through the Society. In addition to

the jobs we advertise directly, we distribute a monthly round up of economist vacancies that is specifically tailored for SPE members by EconomistJobs.

- Networking with fellow economists at our various events with the highlight of our social calendar being our Summer Drinks in partnership with King's College London and held at the landmark Bush House roof terrace.

Who can join?

Full membership of the SPE is for those with a professional interest in economics. The normal qualifications for full membership are either a degree with a substantial economics content and a continuing professional interest in economics; or a degree in another subject together with professional experience in economics or in a related field, such as financial market strategy.

Student and Graduate membership is open to those who are currently studying economics or have recently graduated in economics.

Annual Membership fees: Full Members: £100 pa
Graduate/Student Members: £40 pa

Many employers cover the cost of one professional membership organisation for their employees and, for those who have to cover the cost of membership out of their own funds, membership is tax deductible.
