SBE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 24 November 2014

The Society held its Annual General Meeting on 24 November at Ashurst. Kate Barker, SBE Chairman, gave an overview of the past year and announced changes planned for 2015 including a new Graduate membership class and the launch of the new SBE website. A resolution was passed on changes to the structure of the SBE council, meaning that council members will now serve a maximum of 3 terms, with each term being 3 years. These changes will ensure that the Council has a continuing source of fresh ideas about how to provide the best service to its members.

The Chairman also highlighted the ongoing increase in membership and noted the favourable outcome of efforts to build stronger ties with universities, with student membership rising fivefold. James Lambert, the SBE Treasurer, presented the Society's finances and reported that, excluding exceptional items, the Society generated its first surplus in over five years; a significant improvement of the position in 2012/13. In 2015 the Society will continue its efforts to reduce its costs and seek additional sponsorship and advertising revenue. Efforts to build membership continue apace and additional revenues are expected from the new Affiliate status.

Sandra Curtis, Ian Harwood, James Lambert and Andrew Milligan were re-elected to the SBE Council, their previous terms of office having expired.

Ian Harwood and Bridget Rosewell were congratulated on being made new Fellows of the Society. Both were elected during the year by the Council in recognition of their contributions to business economics and their longstanding support for the Society.
